



Heira in Bora Bora

The Heiva is an annual cultural event in Polynesia. The Bora Bora Heiva is unique in having a sandy stage. It's a real opportunity to share and celebrate. Everyone who participates in the Heiva, whatever their role, shows immense dedication to perpetuating this tradition handed down by their ancestors. From generation to generation, the Heiva takes place and Bora Bora comes alive throughout the month of July. The island's different groups – Hitia, Faanui, Tiipoto, Anau, Nunue and Amanahune – celebrate their culture with song and dance. The Bora Bora Heiva is also an opportunity to discover other cultural activities such as the fruit carrier race, the weaving competition and the flower float competition.



History of the Heirn

The first Tiurai (meaning July) took place in Tahiti on 14 July 1881, then for the first time in Bora Bora after the Second World War. Originally, the inhabitants of Bora Bora travelled with their Raatira (chief) to Vaitape for all the festivities. They slept in the Tu Vavau square or at their family's home. The Tiurai was renamed the Heiva in 1985, in reference to Madeleine Moua's Heiva group, which laid the foundations of ori tahiti (Tahitian dance).





What is the Himene?

Himene are traditional songs. At the Bora Bora Heiva, all the groups compete in the himene category. There are four compulsory songs:

- -Hīmene Tārava: 8 different voices*. The members of the group stand in a semi-circle.
- -Hīmene Rū'au: 8 different voices*, the members of the group sit in a semi-circle and sway from right to left with their finger resting on their cheek.
- -'Ūtē Paripari or the Ūtē Arearea (your choice): 2 voices. Two people sing and converse on the chosen theme (paripari) or on a humorous theme (arearea).
- -Himene Popaa

The songs are composed by the groups around a theme but must follow very precise rules. They are all sung in the Tahitian language.

In addition to the 4 compulsory songs, there are other songs accompanied by aparima mama, a traditional dance (men can also take part).

What is the Oten?

The *otea* is composed around a theme read out at the start of the show in French, English and Tahitian.

Groups must perform the following five categories:

- Ote'a: the dances are performed on traditional percussion (tō'ere, fa'atete, tari parau, 'īhara, pahu, ...).
- **Aparima:** the dances are sung and the gestures represent the words. The theme is represented.
- **Pā'ō'ā:** The dancers sit in a circle or semicircle and clap rhythmically on their thighs. In turn, dancers stand up and dance in duets or solo.
- **Hivināu:** The dancers turn in concentric circles.
- **Orero:** Oneperson narrates the theme in *reo tahiti* (Tahitian language).



The final costume can be made out of dried plants, shells or feathers and must be in keeping with the theme. The plant costume is made by the dancers before the show from fresh plants.





The box office

The ticket office is located next to Radio Bora Bora.

It is also possible to buy tickets on the evening of the show. Tickets cost 2,000 xpf for bleachers and 1,000 xpf for red chairs.

To ent

The "baraques", Fare Tiurai, are specially built for the Heiva. They are open for lunch and dinner.

Don't hesitate to make a reservation if you're a large group or want to dine before the show. You'll also find several snacks near the games.

And don't forget that the food trucks will remain open but will be moved during the Heiva.

Entertainment

There are plenty of games for all ages Everything is on offer to ensure you have a great time.

The Stardium is Heiva's nightclub. It stays open until 3am at weekends.

Anei, a "baraque" offering musical entertainment, also closes late on weekends.


